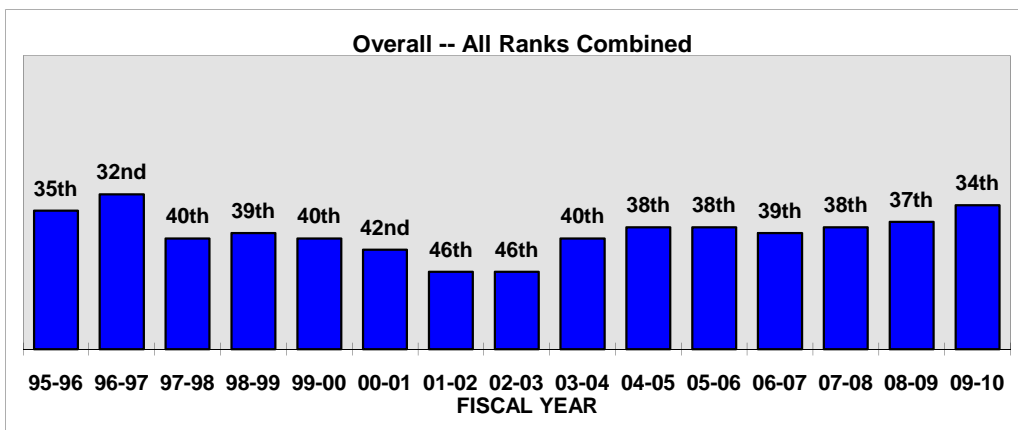

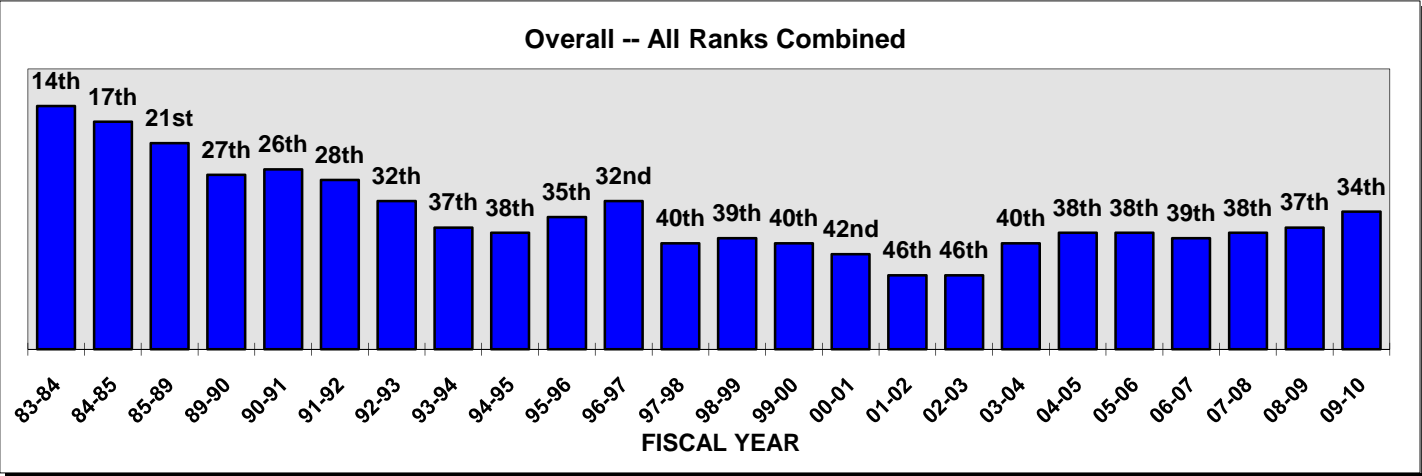

History of Ranking in AAU: 1995-96 to 2009-10

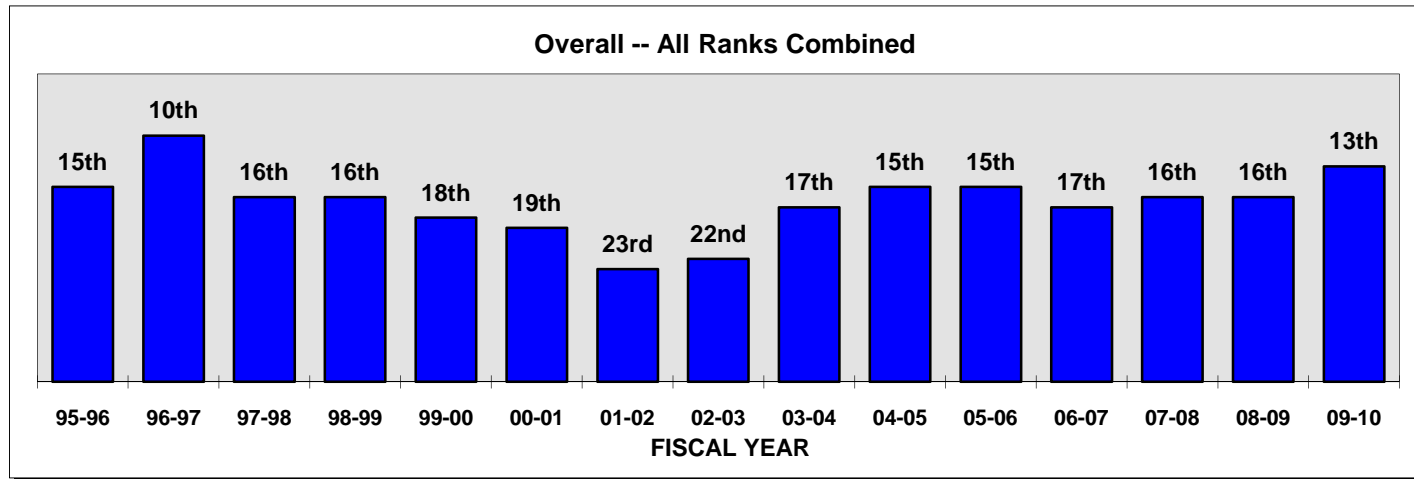
