# **Department of Theatre Name Change Proposal**

**The Proposal:** Change the Name of Department of Theatre to Department of Theatre, Film, and Media Arts

The proposed name change of the Department of Theatre to the **Department of Theatre, Film**, and **Media Arts**, is to integrate current offerings in the Department of Theatre, the Film Studies program, and the Moving-Image Production major.

1. Rationale

With the coming of a new building for Theatre and Moving-Image Production (MIP) in the Arts District, it is now an auspicious moment to consider a bold integration of Theatre and Film on Ohio State's campus. As creative disciplines, Theatre and Film share many related methods and concerns. Currently, Film Studies functions as a program (two minors, BA, MA) that reports directly to the College of Arts and Sciences divisional dean for arts and humanities and MIP as a major (BA) that is administered by the director of film studies.

Film and Theatre's interdisciplinarity is their strength; however, as we move further into the 21<sup>st</sup> century, it is increasingly clear that segregating live and mediated performance both administratively and pedagogically leads to redundancies that could be effectively eliminated through such a union. In addition, it is equally clear that effectively engaging our 21<sup>st</sup> century student artists and scholars entails exploring an array of mediums. We propose bringing these programs together in one department, creating an urgently needed artistic community for our students and faculty.

## 3. Programmatic changes.

The Film Studies Program houses the following degree programs:

- BA Film Studies
- BA Moving-Image Production



- MA Film Studies
- Graduate Interdisciplinary Specialization in Film Studies
- Film Studies Minor
- Screenwriting Minor

Theatre houses the following degree programs:

- BA Theatre
- MA Theatre Studies
- MFA Theatre emphasis in Acting
- MFA Theatre emphasis in Design
- PhD Theatre Studies
- Graduate Cinema and Video Minor
- Theatre Minor
- Musical Theatre Minor
- Media Production and Analysis Minor
- Video Arts Minor

The above curricula would reside in the renamed Department of Theatre, Film, and Media Arts, and would not be modified.

4. How will department name change affect students, faculty, and staff in the current department.

Residing within the new theatre building are plans for MIP facilities and faculty offices. Proximity of these disciplines offer students and faculty greater opportunity for creative practice, research and teaching opportunities. Integrating core faculty from the Film Studies Program into the Department of Theatre, Film, and Media Arts will enhance research and teaching collaborations between faculty in Theatre, Film Studies, and MIP.

5. How will department name change affect students, faculty, and staff outside the proposing unit.

One faculty member (Angus Fletcher) has a 50% FTE in English (his TIU) and a 50% FTE in Film Studies, which would move to the Department of Theatre, Film, and Media Arts. No other faculty have direct appointments in the Film Studies Program. Two staff positions in the Film Studies Program (awaiting replacement hiring approval) will move to the Department of Theatre, Film, and Media Arts these are an Academic Program Coordinator and an Office Associate. The current college academic advisor for the Film Studies Program would continue to advise all of the students pursuing the Film Studies program and MIP degree programs outlined in point 3. Faculty who offer courses which contribute to the Film Studies, MIP, and Screenwriting majors and minors are welcome to request transfer of all or part of their line to the renamed department subject to university guidelines on units transfers, and if the Department of Theatre, Film, and Media Arts supports such a move with a vote (Appendix 1). Additionally, these faculty would have greater opportunities for collaborative teaching, research, and creative inquiry.



The proposal for the major in Moving-Image Production was approved in 2016 on the condition that three additional faculty lines would be approved in Moving-Image Production. Thus far, only one line has been granted, and there are not sufficient faculty to staff the courses for the pre-major and major in Moving-Image Production. An MOU will need to be established between the Department of Theatre, Film, and Media Arts and the Executive Dean of the College of Arts & Sciences that specifies a hiring rotation for the next four years. Specifically, the MIP proposal that was approved through OAA in 2017 specifies two additional hires necessary to staff the Program, one in Narrative, and one in Documentary.

## 6. Administrative Changes

There should be no administrative changes in the programs. However, the Executive Dean of the College of Arts & Sciences has authorized an external search for a chair of the Department of Theatre that will take place in Autumn 2020. The new faculty member will chair the Department of Theatre and Media Arts beginning Autumn 2021.

### 7. Status

Positive unanimous vote (May 15, 2020) from the Department of Theatre faculty to change the department name to the Department of Theatre, Film, and Media Arts.

### 8. Fiscal impact

The budget for the Film Studies Program will move into the Department of Theatre, Film, and Media Arts. Moving-Image Production will continue to operate on startup funds through FY21. Once those funds run out, The College of Arts & Sciences is committed to ensure that sufficient PBA is available for Moving-Image Production-related staffing and equipment. Once Moving-Image Production receives PBA from the College of Arts & Sciences, that budget will move into the Department of Theatre, Film, and Media Arts. A line item for equipment will need to be included in the budget for the Department of Theatre, Film and Media Arts as equipment is necessary to run the courses that contribute to the Pre-Major and Major in Moving-Image Production. The technology fee would continue to apply to all undergraduate majors in the Department of Theatre, Film, and Media Arts.
