A PROPOSAL FROM THE COUNCIL ON ACADEMIC AFFAIRS TO RAISE THE CAP ON CLINICAL FACULTY, COLLEGE OF OPTOMETRY

Whereas a proposal for an exception to Faculty Rule 3335-7 is required to revise the

requirement that the percentage of clinical/teaching/practice faculty cannot be

more than 40% of the total tenure track/, clinical/teaching/practice, and

research faculty; and

Whereas the College of Optometry proposes that the cap be raised to 48% to enable the

College to carry out its educational and clinical missions more effectively

without relying excessively on associated faculty appointments, and this change will allow the conversion of as many as six current associated faculty to the clinical track, improving their career trajectory, improving morale, and enabling

them to teach didactic courses as needed; and

Whereas exceptions to the 40% have already been approved for the Colleges of Medicine,

Nursing and Dentistry; and

Whereas appointments will be made following established search processes as described

in the College's Appointment, Promotion and Tenure document; and

Whereas the proposal has the support of the Dean, the College Faculty Advisory

Committee, and unanimous support of the faculty; and

Whereas the proposal was reviewed and approved by the Council on Academic Affairs at

its meeting on September 7, 2022; and

Therefore be it resolved that the University Senate approve the proposal from the College of Optometry to raise the cap on clinical faculty and respectfully requests approval by the Board of Trustees.
